Shalom

Fall is in the air! Beautiful sunshine, breezy, cool nights, colored leaves and fall activities at home, at school and at work are in full swing!

We begin October with World Communion Sunday and the rite of confirmation for those who have completed two years of classes and activities, and feel ready to move into this next chapter of their life of faith.

A trip down memory land has visited me as I have been through the decision time with this class. The passage of time has brought many before us in my time here – youth who have done the work of confirmation and have continued on their life journey, becoming men and women who will make a difference. We are so blessed to be even a part of God's movement in their lives, as they grow into the potentiality God has placed within each. And my memories have gone back even further, into the past before St Charles and Dover – other churches, other families, other youth. Even back to my years of classes and commitments of my own younger years. Do you remember back when we confirm God's work in these youth, remembering your own time of classes, the group you were with in church?

If you do, do you remember the reading, the learning, the worship expectations? We ask them to be in worship (this year a once a month commitment), to attend weekly classes and do the necessary reading and homework, to engage in mission opportunities, and field trips, for two years.

So, then I began to wonder, what are we modeling to them as the adult faith life?

When they come to church, is the church there to greet them? Are they seeing regular attendance by those who are already a part of the church? What model are they seeing of what regular attendance looks like – in their own families and in the church family in all seasons of the year?

How about adults continuing to learn and grow, beyond confirmation? We ask them to attend classes every week, to read scripture, to learn church history, to learn more about God and the practices of faith at this time in their life. Do they see in the church, in the adults who claim faith for themselves, the same level and commitment to learning and growing in faith? Are adults involved in small groups, like the youth are asked to be?

As our commitment to church attendance and study has changed, so has the visibility of youth after confirmation. So, in my 'trip down memory lane', I have also reflected on the changes I have seen over the years. Sadly, I have begun to realize that our youth have gotten their sense of graduation and 'doneness' after the confirmation class time in what they see within the churches and in the adults they are watching.

Let me share another example. This comes from my walking each day out in the community in the non-winter days. I see many families out riding their bicycles. You know what I have noticed? For the most part, the children are wearing helmets. You know what else I have observed? The parents often are not wearing helmets. The message being given, I hope unconsciously, is that 'when I become an adult, I won't have to wear a helmet'!

Are we, without intending to do so, giving the message to our youth, that when they become an adult God is asking for less engagement and focus? That there is less need to learn and grow?

It is worth thinking and praying about.



Walk to Emmaus – A Journey with Christ

While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them..- Luke 24:15

The walk to Emmaus is an experience of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a three-day short course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus experience begins with the prayerful invitation from a sponsor – or someone who has walked the journey before you. Just as Christ walked with the disciples on the road to Emmaus, a sponsor walks with both you and Christ to ensure you don't walk alone in this journey.

Who should go to an Emmaus weekend? Emmaus is open to members of any Christian denomination who's aim is for the development of Christian leaders who ...

- Are members of a local church
- Have a desire to strengthen their spiritual lives
- May have unanswered questions about their faith
- Are willing to dedicate their everyday lives to God in an ongoing manner

What happens on this 3-day weekend? You will enjoy three days of singing, learning, laughing, worshiping, reflecting, praying and participating in small groups. Discussions center around fifteen talks given by laity and clergy. These talks present the theme of God's grace, how that grace comes alive in the Christian community and how it is expressed to the world. You'll also discover how grace is real in your life, how you live a life of grace, and how you bring that grace to others.

What happens after an Emmaus Weekend? You are invited to have a closer walk with Christ for the rest of your life. Where the retreat is 3 days of your life – the days following your walk are referred to as your 4th Days.
